"It is expressly agreed that the notification requirement <u>set out herein</u>, shall continue..." (language removed "setout in item 11")

The Hearing Committee, in accepting the recommendation, incorporates the Settlement Agreement with the abovementioned correction.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

WHEREAS pursuant to the *Pharmacy Act* of Nova Scotia, allegations were set out in a Registrar's complaints dated January 29th, 2013, May 21st, 2013 and August 28th, 2013 alleging that Ms. Ross breached provisions of the *Pharmacy Act* and Regulations made there under, and conducted herself in a way in which a Hearing Committee properly constituted under the *Pharmacy Act* could conclude that her conduct amounted to professional misconduct,


AND WHEREAS the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists and Ms. Ross believe that a Settlement Agreement is the proper method of disposing of this matter,

AND WHEREAS the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists and Ms. Ross agree to the following statement of facts:

- 1. THAT while engaged in the practice of pharmacy as a pharmacist at St., Sydney, NS, Ms. Ross engaged in professional misconduct and conduct unbecoming contrary to the *Pharmacy Act* and Regulations, in that:
 - (a) Ms. Ross acted unlawfully and without integrity in that Ms. Ross removed benzodiazepines from the pharmacy inventory for personal use, without a valid prescription. These actions constitute a breach of the Controlled Drug and Substances Act (CDSA) and the Benzodiazepine and Other Targeted Substances Regulations and are contrary to the Pharmacy Act and Regulations, and Code of Ethics, in that:
 - (i) Ms. Ross removed a total of 200 PMS-Lorazepam 2mg, for personal use, from the inventory of on November 25th, 2012 and on December 15th, 2012 without a valid prescription and without payment.

- (ii) Ms. Ross admits that she removed an undisclosed amount of lorazepam, for personal use, from the inventory of 322 Prince Street, Sydney NS between July 2011 and May 2012, without a valid prescription and without payment.
- (iii) Ms. Ross admits that she made manual adjustments to remove the lorazepam from the computer inventory to conceal her actions.
- 2: THAT while engaged in the practice of pharmacy at Sydney, NS, at Sydney, NS, at Sydney, NS, at St., Sydney, NS, Ms. Ross engaged in professional misconduct and conduct unbecoming contrary to the *Pharmacy Act* and Regulations, in that:
 - (a) Ms. Ross acted unlawfully and without honesty or integrity in creating and dispensing a total of 160 prescriptions between February 2008 and March 2013, that Ms. Ross knew were neither valid nor authentic, and fraudulently billed those prescriptions to an insurer. These actions constitute a breach of the Controlled Drug and Substances Act (CDSA), the Benzodiazepine and Other Targeted Substances Regulations, the Food and Drug Act and its regulations, and the Pharmacy Act and its regulations; and all are contrary to the Model Standards of Practice and the Code of Ethics.
 - (i) Between November 2009 and December 2012, Ms. Ross created and dispensed 89 fraudulent prescriptions for herself; including 71 for Schedule F drugs and 18 prescriptions for benzodiazepines, that Ms. Ross knew were neither valid nor authentic. Ms. Ross falsely documented that these prescriptions has been authorized by Dr. Dr. has confirmed that she did not order or authorize these prescriptions. A list of these prescriptions is provided in Schedule A.
 - Between October 2009 and March 2013, Ms. Ross created and dispensed 49 fraudulent prescriptions for Schedule F drugs for that Ms. Ross knew were neither valid nor authentic. Ms. Ross falsely documented that these prescriptions had been authorized by Dr. Dr. has confirmed that she did not order or authorize these prescriptions. A list of these prescriptions is provided in Schedule B.

- (iii) Between February 2008 and February 2011, Ms. Ross created and dispensed eight fraudulent prescriptions for lorazepam 2mg and two prescriptions for fluoxetine 20mg in the name of that Ms. Ross knew were neither valid nor authentic, and dispensed the prescriptions for her own personal use. Ms. Ross falsely documented that these prescriptions had been authorized by Dr. Dr. has confirmed that he did not order or authorize these prescriptions. A list of these prescriptions is provided in Schedule C.
- (iv) Between August 2009 and April 2012, Ms. Ross created and dispensed five Schedule F drugs for that Ms. Ross knew were neither valid nor authentic. Ms. Ross falsely documented that these prescriptions had been authorized by Dr. Dr. has confirmed that he did not order these prescriptions. A list of these prescriptions is provided in Schedule C.
- 3. THAT while engaged in the practice of pharmacy at Sydney, NS, and/or while engaged as a pharmacy manager responsible for the day-to-day management of the Pharmacy, Ms. Ross engaged in professional misconduct and conduct unbecoming contrary to the *Pharmacy Act* and Regulations, in that:
 - (a) Ms. Ross failed in the practice of, and responsibility for, the maintenance of proper records for drugs and devices, in particular, Ms. Ross failed to maintain control of an inventory of a controlled substance contrary to the CDSA, the Benzodiazepine and other Targeted Substances Regulations, and the Pharmacy Act and its regulations; and the Model Standards of Practice for Canadian Pharmacists.
 - While Ms. Ross acted as pharmacy manager from April 2011 to May 2012, 1918 tablets of lorazepam were removed from the inventory of St., Sydney, NS, without authorization or a valid prescription. Specifically:
 - (a) Between April 2011 and May 2012, a total of 641 tablets of all brands of lorazepam 2mg were removed from the computer inventory without authorization or a valid prescription.
 - (b) Between June 2011 and May 2012, a total of 741 tablets of all brands of lorazepam 1mg were removed from the computer inventory without authorization or a valid prescription.



(a) Ms. Ross acted unlawfully and without honesty or integrity on August 13, 2013, by engaging in fraud and misrepresentation while providing a urine sample to East Coast Mobile Medical (ECMM). These actions

Pharmacy Act and Regulations, in that:

constitute a breach of the *Pharmacy Act* and its regulations, and are contrary to the *Code of Ethics*.

- (i) As part of an assessment of fitness to practice, on the morning of August 13th, 2013, Ms. Ross was required to provide a urine sample. Ms. Ross attended to provide the urine sample with a concealed device containing urine that was not her own.
- (ii) When the ECMM specimen collector determined that Ms. Ross had provided a false sample, Ms. Ross was advised that she must provide a witnessed urine specimen. Ms. Ross refused to do so and revealed that she had a concealed device and urine that was not her own.
- (iii) Ms. Ross then left the meeting with ECMM and refused to provide a urine sample.

Ms. Ross specifically acknowledges and agrees to all of the facts stated above.

The Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists and Ms. Ross hereby agree to the following disposition and settlement of this matter:

- 1. Ms. Ross acknowledges and agrees that her conduct noted above amounts to professional misconduct and conduct unbecoming contrary to the *Pharmacy Act* and Regulations.
- 2. A letter of reprimand in the form attached shall be placed on the file of Shelley Ross.
- 3. The licence of Ms. Ross to practise pharmacy in Nova Scotia shall be suspended for a period of 6 months. The period of suspension shall run from August 21st, 2013 to February 21st, 2014. It is recognized by Ms. Ross that this suspension is separate and apart from the ongoing assessment of her fitness to practice due to addiction related issues.
- 4. Ms. Ross shall pay a fine of \$5,000.00 to the NSCP on the earlier of, 30 days from the date Ms. Ross is licensed to practise pharmacy in any jurisdiction, or, June 30, 2016.
- 5. Ms. Ross shall pay a portion of the NSCP's costs for this matter, fixed at the amount of \$10,000.00, to be paid on the earlier of:
 - a. Payment of 24 equal installments of \$416.66, beginning on the first day of the month, of the first month after Ms. Ross is licensed to practice pharmacy in any jurisdiction; or,
 - b. Payment by way of single lump sum payment on or before June 30, 2016.

- 6. Ms. Ross hereby consents to judgment in the full amount of \$15,000.00 (\$5,000.00 for the fine and \$10,000.00 for costs) in the form attached. The consent judgment shall be signed and executed on behalf of Ms. Ross and the College and shall be held in escrow by the College and shall only be filed and executed on the earlier of:
 - a. Ms. Ross no longer actively seeks license to practice pharmacy in Nova Scotia and the \$15,000.00, or any part thereof, remains unpaid; or
 - b. Ms. Ross is licensed to practice pharmacy in any jurisdiction and payment is not made consistent with the terms immediately above.

For clarity, if Ms. Ross is making payments of \$416.66 per month and is not in default of any terms past June 30, 2016, the order would continue to be held in escrow as long as payments are made and there is no default at any time.

- 7. Ms. Ross hereby consents and agrees to notify the NSCP of every pharmacy where she practices pharmacy, for three years from the date of any resumption of practice.
- 8. Ms. Ross hereby consents and agrees that notice of this settlement agreement shall be provided to any future pharmacy manager and any future employers for three years from the date of any resumption of practice.
- 9. Ms. Ross hereby consents and agrees that the NSCP may communicate with Ms. Ross's future pharmacy manager, and any future employers for three years from the date of any resumption of practice, regarding any matters relating to this settlement agreement.
- 10. For a period of three years from any resumption of practice, Ms. Ross shall notify the Registrar of the NSCP of the name of her Primary Care Providers, including medical, dentistry, nurse practitioner, and pharmacy. Ms. Ross consents that these Primary Care Providers may communicate with the College regarding her fitness to practice and Ms. Ross expressly authorizes the Primary Care Providers to communicate with the College regarding her fitness to practice.
- 11. Ms. Ross hereby consents to only obtain prescriptions drugs for herself if they are prescribed by an authorized prescriber other than herself.
- 12. Ms. Ross herby consents to only receiving prescriptions for benzodiazepines if they are prescribed by an authorized prescriber and with the full knowledge of her Primary Care Provider(s).
- 13. Within 5 days of Ms. Ross receiving any authorized prescriptions for benzodiazepines, Ms. Ross shall notify the NSCP of any benzodiazepines prescribed to her. It is expressly agreed that the notification requirement set out in item 11 shall continue for as long as Ms. Ross has a license to practice pharmacy in Nova Scotia.

- 14. Other than as authorized by Article 11, it is expressly agreed by Ms. Ross that she shall abstain from and not use any benzodiazepines in any manner whatsoever.
- 15. There shall be publication with name, of the facts and details of the Settlement Agreement in accordance with Qualification and Professional Accountability Regulation, Section 21.
- 16. If Ms. Ross is assessed to be fit for practice and returns to practice as a pharmacist licensed to practice in Nova Scotia, the following conditions shall be placed on Ms. Ross's license from the effective date of her resumption of practice as a licensed pharmacist:
 - a. Ms. Ross shall not hold the position of pharmacy manager at any pharmacy.
 - b. Ms. Ross shall not work alone in the dispensary of a pharmacy for a period of three years from the effective date of any resumption of practice as a licensed pharmacist.
 - c. It is the express agreement of Ms. Ross that she shall not order or receive benzodiazepines for a period of three years from the effective date of any resumption of practice. Ordering or receiving benzodiazepines includes ordering or receiving benzodiazepines from wholesale suppliers and the ordering, receipt or purchase of benzodiazepines from other pharmacies.
 - d. The restrictions in 15(c) shall not apply if the ordering of benzodiazepines is required due to an unforeseen, urgent and exceptional requirement due to the unavailability of the pharmacy manager, or alternative pharmacist for a period greater than 72 hours.
 - e. For a period of three years from the effective date of any resumption of practice, Ms. Ross shall immediately report to her pharmacy manager all verbal order prescriptions for benzodiazepines that Ms. Ross receives, to ensure that the pharmacy manager may review the prescription to ensure the authenticity of the verbal order prescription.
 - f. Ms Ross consents and agrees that as a condition on her license the pharmacy manager where Ms Ross practices shall report all discrepancies identified in the monthly narcotic reconciliation records, the audit of which is to include benzodiazepines, to the NSCP for a period of three years from the effective date of her resumption of practice as a licensed pharmacist.
 - g. There shall be three (3) inspections performed in any pharmacy in which Ms. Ross is practicing within 24 months of the effective date of any resumption of practice. The cost of the three (3) inspections shall be borne in full by Ms. Ross.

- 17. Ms. Ross shall enroll in, undertake, and successfully complete, within twelve months of the date of this Settlement Agreement, Mount Saint Vincent University's Business Ethics Course, BUSI 2250, or a reasonably similar course of study approved by the Registrar of the NSCP.
- 18. It is recognized by Ms. Ross that this Settlement Agreement is separate and apart from the ongoing assessment of her fitness to practice due to addiction related issues.

The Investigation Committee of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists and Ms. Shelley Ross agree that this Settlement Agreement shall be put to a Hearing Committee of the Nova Scotia College of Pharmacists for its review.
