Re: Pharmacist Prescribing Inhaled Budesonide for Mild SARS-CoV-2 Respiratory Symptoms

Pharmacists may now prescribe inhaled budesonide for the treatment of mild SARS-CoV-2 respiratory symptoms in accordance with the <u>Standards of Practice: Prescribing Drugs</u>, <u>Appendix G - Prescribing for a Diagnosis</u> <u>Supported by a Protocol</u>.

Nova Scotia Health is looking to improve access to inhaled budesonide across the province given ongoing high rates of SARS-CoV-2 infection. PANS has been working closely with government and will be communicating information regarding billing and other resources shortly.

What does this new prescribing authority enable?

• This authority enables pharmacists to prescribe inhaled budesonide for the treatment of mild SARS-CoV-2 respiratory symptoms when using the <u>Nova Scotia Health Inhaled Budesonide Prescribing Protocol</u>.

Can another protocol be used when prescribing inhaled budesonide for the treatment of mild SARS-CoV-2 respiratory symptoms?

- Pharmacists can only prescribe inhaled budesonide for the treatment of SARS-CoV-2 when they do so in accordance with the <u>Nova Scotia Health Inhaled Budesonide Prescribing Protocol</u>. Please note:
 - Inhaled budesonide may only be prescribed by pharmacists for the treatment of SARS-CoV-2 (no other indications)
 - The dose for the treatment of SARS-CoV-2 is 800 mcg twice daily
 - Therapeutic substitutions for nebules, other inhaled corticosteroids, or oral/IV corticosteroids are not permitted within the protocol
